## There is No Stagnant Place For Me

When I first walked into the doors of AA on Margarita at the Hill Center I wasn't an alcoholic and introduced myself as Jill. I liked all of you, because I didn't feel condemned for the things I had done. Your stories seemed a lot worse than mine. It was better than watching Jerry Springer. I would leave and buy my wine at Trader Joes. After a few weeks through a "self imposed crisis" I came to a place of desperation and became willing to concede that I was an alcoholic and I couldn't ENJOY and CONTROL my drinking.

I got a wonderful sponsor, and she gave me clear direction: 90 meetings in 90 days, call three women a day, call her every day for the first 30 days and read the Big Book. Picking up the phone was hard, but I think I called one woman a day and the Big Book was boring except for the parts on sex and resentments - I understood that. For the first year I was really depressed, resentful and I cried and whined and complained at every meeting I went to. I joined a step study in my first year and that is how I worked my steps. It is by Grace that I made it that first year.

After 3 years I had lost contact with my sponsor, and didn't get a new sponsor, and I came to meetings occasionally because my life regained color, magic, beauty, financial security and my marriage improved and my relationship with my four children flourished. Although at 7 years I didn't even pick up a chip because I was at AA so rarely. At that same time I had hit my top weight and began going to Overeaters Anonymous where I got a new OA sponsor and began reading through the Big Book with her paragraph by paragraph, on the telephone when I called her at 7:00 am **promptly** 4 days a week. She lived in LA.

Now at 10 years of sobriety I often think I should be further along my spiritual journey than I am. My life isn't perfect and my list of character defects is growing!! Relationships expose my weaknesses and I am so grateful that I know whenever I am disturbed about YOU, it is me that I need to look at.

I have submitted myself to this 12 step process again because it is a means by which I have found access to the Power of God which has got me sober and keeps me sober. It is done TO ME, not BY me, which differs from a self help program.

The Big Book states that my hope is the maintenance and growth of a spiritual experience, and through the gift of pain and desperation I'm continually brought to greater awareness and willingness to the spiritual disciples of step 10 and 11: morning meditation and prayer, nightly review, 10<sup>th</sup> step spot check. One of the greatest awakenings I have had is the gift of working with others and sponsorship. This is an experience that is indescribable as I watch miracles happen and lives changed. I sponsor several remarkable women because like Eric Liddell said in Chariots of Fire when asked why he ran, "I believe God made me for a purpose....and when I run I feel his pleasure." That is my experience with sponsoring. I've also experienced tremendous sorrow when some relapse and when one woman died last year with an accidental overdose of alcohol and pills.

Everyday I am moving closer to God or closer to alcohol. There is no stagnant place for me.

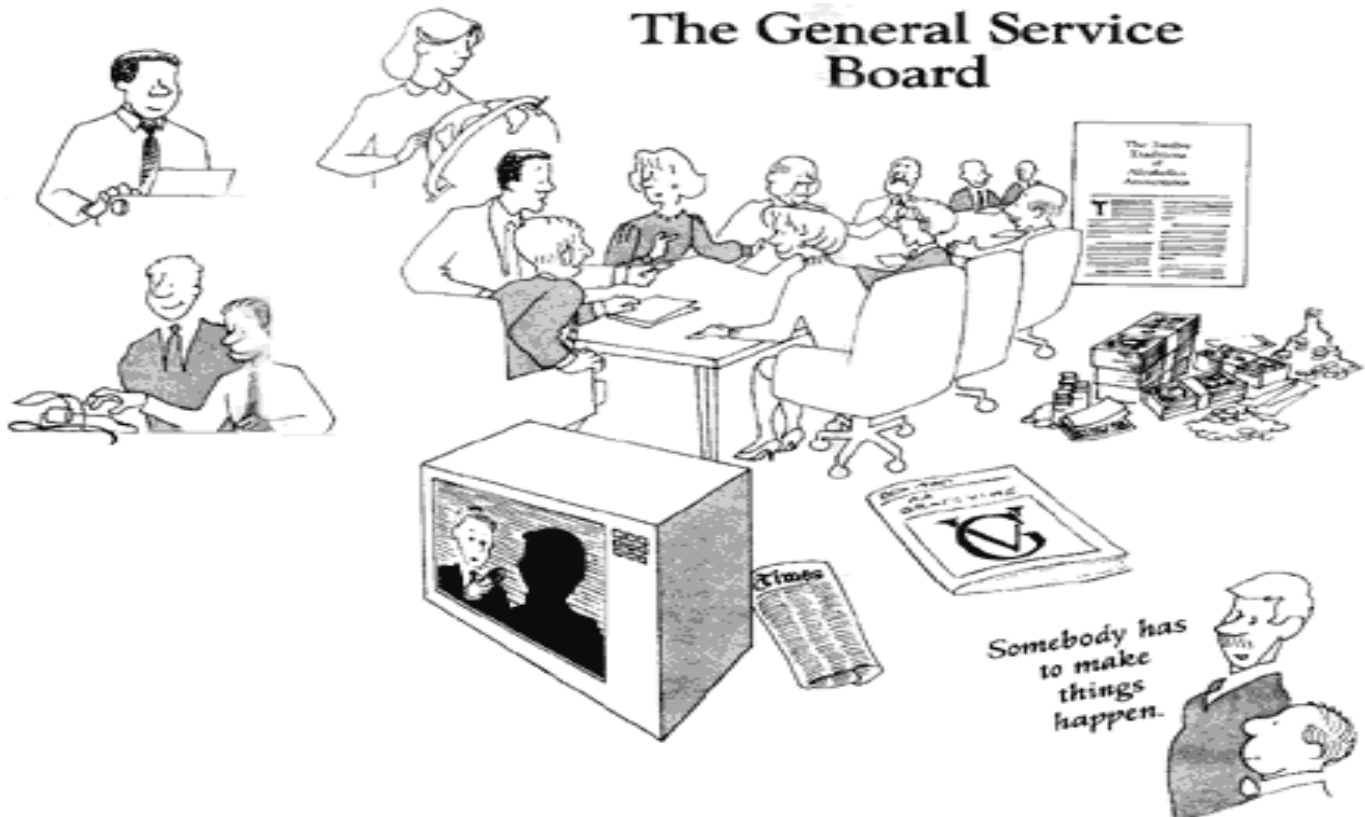

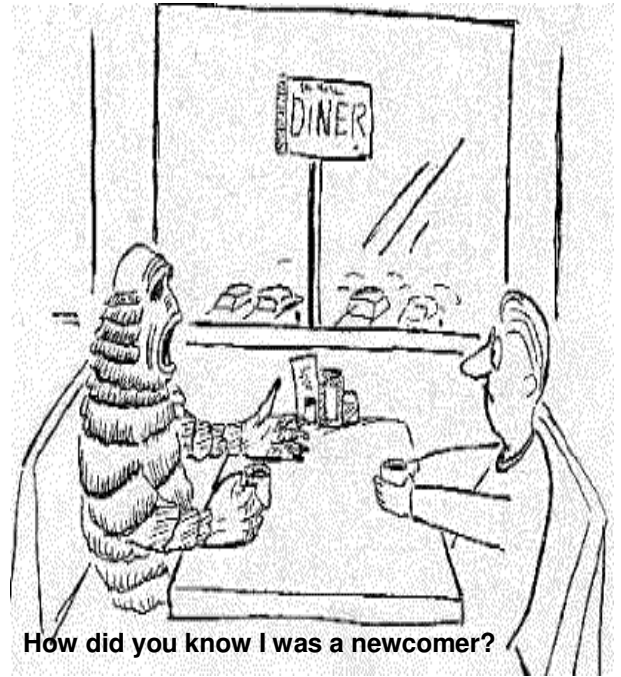

**How did you know I was a newcomer?**

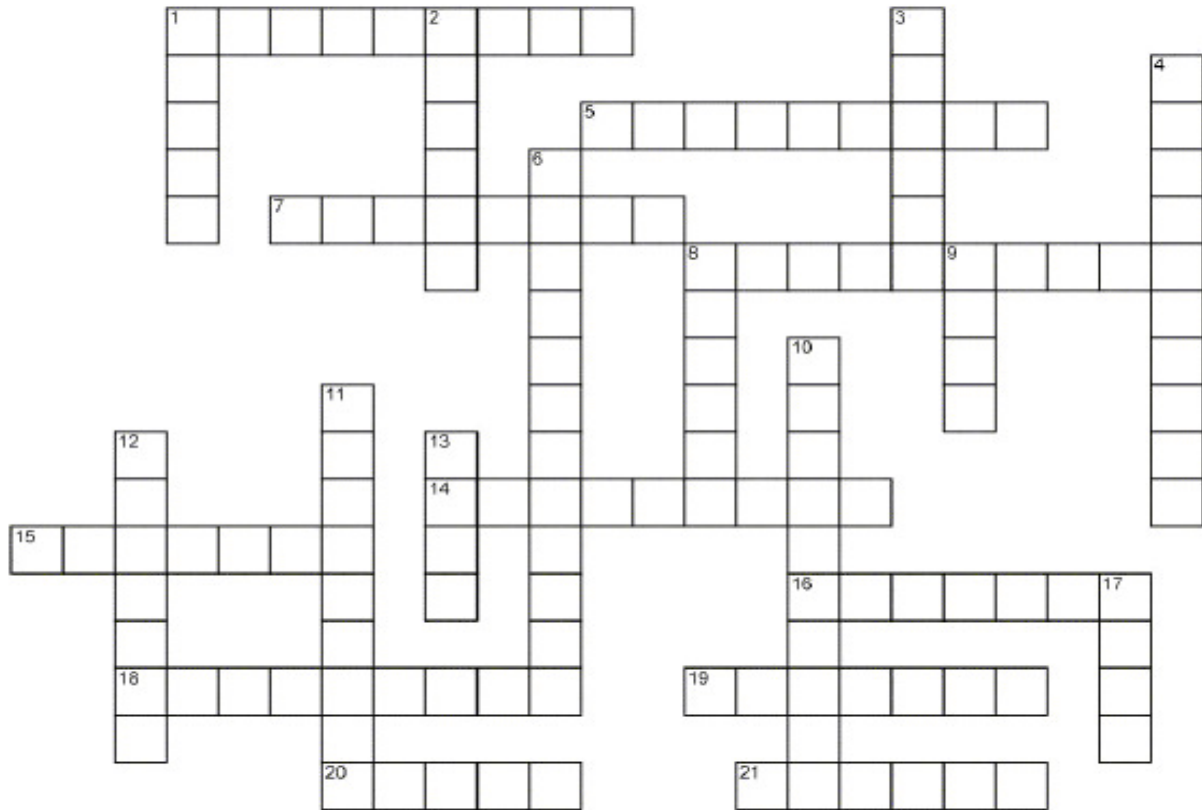
When I was drinking I went to extremes. I was either a victim or I was an assassin. It wasn't a character defect I gave up easily when I got sober.

In order to Bridge the Gap, AA members have volunteered to be temporary contacts & introduce newcomers to AA. It is suggested that the temporary contact take the newcomer to a variety of AA meetings; introduce him or her to other AA's; insure that he or she has some phone numbers of several AA members and share the experience of sponsorship and a home group.

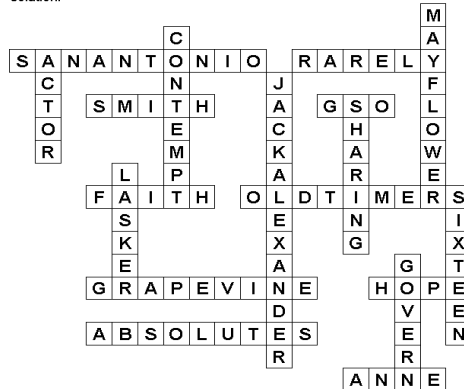
