This meeting got its start 22 years ago by 3 guys, they wanted to make an exclusive meeting, and when they found out they couldn't, they left but a few diehards remained. The original location was Mountain View Church, for many years, meeting every day but Sunday at 7am. After the closing of the Lake Elsinore Alano Club, Wild Ones was one of the main meetings serving Lake Elsinore. The meeting remained strong for many years, but lost its location following the pandemic. They lost their original location, then lost two more. It almost vanished, but a small and committed group created a new location off Central, John's Barn. Today the Wild Ones lives on, and is there for you if you need a meeting!
