Feature Article

Breaking Chains by Lyn P. Unity Hall

I had a flashback driving home from the gym the other day. Where eastbound Clinton Keith ends, a nob of a dirt road begins. At the top of the hill, the expanse of the Murrieta Valley is photoworthy. The private lots are guarded by barbed wire or sturdy chain fencing. I was in such a hurry to capture a certain cloud formation situated perfectly above a set of hills in the distance I almost drove through a sturdy, chain barrier. I quickly stopped short of damaging my Surf Mobile, not to mention the property owner's fence line, creating a little dust cloud.

About 30 years ago, I created a little dramatic dust in my intrepid, drunken youth, too. I remember I was out dancing with some friends, and my boyfriend, Eli in tow. All I wanted to do was dance but I only liked dancing when I felt euphoric and tipsy. With all of the rhythmic moves I was making folks would notice and perhaps recognize my Footloose dancing abilities – whatever they were.

During the course of the night, Eli was incessantly harping on me about how many shots of Jose Cuervo I'd consumed, belittling me in front of my friends. I didn't want to create an outward scene but there was an intense melodrama playing in my head. In a huff, I decided to leave. I had driven to the popular restaurant in my compact, Datsun B-210. I remember getting into the car feeling dejected and angry; I was crying and I was drunk. Eli came out of the restaurant looking for me, but I raced past him down a long, dirt driveway adjacent to the building. Damn him! Jerk! Thud! Crash! My car was spinning out of control until it all came to a sliding stop. Dead silence. Remember that dust I was talking about earlier? Well, the darkness combined with a good-sized plume of soil occluded my inebriated perception for a minute or two. Not to mention I was a tad bit dizzy.

I knew I drove through something. The car's engine had died, but the headlights provided enough light to see a silhouette of a man standing near the front of my car. That's all I remember. The next morning, I awakened at Eli's house and was sicker than sick. He was kind and comforting, tending to my need to sleep more of 'it' off. *Bring the trash can closer to the bed. Water, please. I think I'm dying.*

I've been sober since December 3, 2010. In working the steps with my sponsor, being of service, listening to others share, and by not taking that first drink I've remained sober. The *Big Book* says it best:

Despite all we can say, many who are real alcoholics are not going to believe they are in that class. By every form of self-deception and experimentation, they will try to prove themselves exceptions to the rule, therefore, nonalcoholic.' (p. 31).

Me? Alcoholic? Yep. What a relief to know that I'm not alone; I can talk about these things with people who understand. There's much more to my story, as I'm sure there is for everyone who seeks the hope of recovery in Alcoholics Anonymous. Today, I'm grateful for my camera, for the vast open fields and for remaining sober to best appreciate the beauty of vast landscapes while breaking a different kind of chain - one day at a time.




