The 7:00 am Community House Church, "As Bill Sees It," meeting consists of a small group of AA members seated around four tables in what once was the living room of a classic, old farmhouse in Old Town Murrieta. The meeting is filled with enthusiastic joy for life and hearty rounds of laughter. There is a sense of home and a reunion with brothers and sisters sharing experiences of life on life's terms. This is only one aspect of the uniqueness of the meeting.

Some form of the phrase, "Let us love you until you can love yourself," is often spoken in the rooms but frequently difficult to accomplish. However, the spirit of the phrase lives in the Old Town Murrieta meeting daily. The meeting is devoid of critical judgment, instead replaced by unconditional love and acceptance of each member who passes through that creaky, old farmhouse door. The attitude of care and compassion helps each member to build a secure foundation for a happy, joyous and free sobriety.

Early on in the life of the meeting it experienced growing pains that served to hone the members' gracious attitude of love and welcoming, and make this an experience cherished by many. Members rely on the meeting to start each day with gratitude for the love and sobriety offered in this room. Those of us who call this group home keep in mind the words of Dr. Bob, "Remember, Bill, let's keep it simple." AA and the "As Bill Sees It" meeting in Old Town Murrieta boils down to the principles of love and service.

Two old timers and a newcomer were stranded on an island. After several months, one of them found a lantern on the beach, polished it clean, and out popped a genie. "In return for my freedom, I will grant each of you one wish", announced the genie.

The first old timer said, "I have a loving wife at home, my relationships with my children have been healed, and I have four beautiful grandchildren. I surely do miss them. We make and distribute your meeting schedules and we publish the Gratitude Gazette.







It is suggested that the temporary contact take the newcomer to a variety of AA meetings; introduce him or her to other AA's; insure that he or she has some phone numbers of several AA members and share the experience of sponsorship and a home group.
